Abstract:

The Carolina Justice Policy Center (CJPC) was a nonprofit organization founded in 1975 under the name Prison and Jail Project in Durham, North Carolina, whose primary mission was criminal justice reform in North Carolina. The collection comprises CJPC's office files and records documenting its staff and activities over the span of four decades, as well as the work of other local, regional, and national organizations. The records include correspondence, including exchanges with inmates and attorneys; meeting agendas and minutes; operational files; court records and case files; research files; books, articles, reports, and clippings; some photographs; a few born-digital items; and analog audio recordings, films, and videos. Includes a group of materials on Velma Barfield, executed in 1984. Topics include criminal justice and sentencing reform; the death penalty; prison conditions and construction; juveniles and women in the court and prison systems; prison-related statistics; alternatives to incarceration; racial justice; violence prevention; and rehabilitative programs. Acquired as part of the Human Rights Archive at Duke University.

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Background

Scope and Content

Collection consists of records documenting the work of the Carolina Justice Policy Center (CJPC), a nonprofit agency in Durham, N.C., focused on the death penalty and criminal justice reform, including materials created from 1975 to 1992 while it was known as the Prison and Jail Project (PJP). The majority of the records are resource and case files assembled by PJP and CJPC staff over four decades, from the 1970s to 2017; contents include correspondence with activists, attorneys, inmates, and other organizations; handwritten notes; meeting minutes; advocacy and outreach materials; conference files; fact sheets and statistical charts; ephemera from organizations and protest movements such as handouts and fliers; and many North Carolina legislative and court records.

In addition to the print materials such as serial issues and clippings found throughout the files, there is also a substantial resource file series of published articles, reports, manuals, and books. There are also analog video and sound recordings, a few born-digital recordings, and some photographs. There are several pieces of inmate art on textiles in the incarcerated persons subseries.

The majority of the CJPC records concern the death penalty, particularly its status in North Carolina, and efforts at the local, regional, and national level to abolish capital punishment. There are many case files pertaining to inmates on death row, including several boxes of materials on Velma Barfield, executed in 1984, the only woman executed in N.C. since 1944. Many of the records also speak to race and gender discrimination in the courts and in prisons, and document CJPC's work in support of the N.C. Racial Justice Act. Other materials document CJPC's work on prohibiting the death penalty for juveniles and people with mental disabilities.

Related CJPC projects documented in the collection include the Durham Community Penalties Program and its mission to provide alternative, community-based penalties for incarcerated people, and Triangle Residential Options for Substance Abusers (TROSA). Other CJPC-based projects include acquiring funding for improving prison conditions, organizing violence prevention forums, increasing accountability for forensic science departments, and advocating for victims of domestic violence.

Note: Materials in this collection may use outdated and/or offensive terms such as "mentally retarded" to refer to people with mental disabilities.

Biographical/Historical

The Carolina Justice Policy Center was part of a coalition of groups in NC and elsewhere whose work focused on the death penalty, mass incarceration, and other issues related to prisoners' rights and criminal justice reform.

In 1975, Alan McGregor co-founded the Prison and Jail Project, which focused on sentencing reform through legislation, improving prison conditions, and gathering information on the death penalty. In the early 1980s, the Prison and Jail Project began to expand its mission under the direction of Lao Rubert to include alternative penalties, violence prevention, and rehabilitative programs, and in 1992 the organization changed its name to the Carolina Justice Policy Center (CJPC), with the Prison and Jail Project continuing as a program under the agency of CJPC.

In 2019, CJPC transitioned to a broader mission that engages with structural racism and civil rights, renaming itself Emancipate NC.

Scope and Contents

These administrative records document the operation, management, and fundraising efforts of the Carolina Justice Policy Center (CJPC) from its founding in 1975 to 2015. The largest series documents CJPC's efforts to secure grant funding. In addition to routine office files, the series also includes a large group of conference materials, and many files of meeting minutes taken at CJPC meetings and other events attended by CJPC staff. Oversize materials include charts and tearsheets of notes.

Scope and Contents

These files were originally housed in office binders, and consist of materials from chiefly local and regional conferences attended or organized by CJPC staff. Files typically include conference agendas, presentation materials, printed materials such as fliers and newsletters, and handwritten notes. Topics represented include the death penalty, substance abuse, re-entry, recidivism, community corrections, violence prevention, and alternatives to incarceration. Conferences include "Corrections at the Crossroads"; "Death Penalty: Trial and Post-Conviction"; "Invest in Change"; "Reducing Barriers to Re-Entry"; "Religious Community's Roles in Breaking the Cycle of Violence and Vengeance"; "Sustaining Services, Seminar for Key Decision Makers"; as well as materials for several smaller meetings and fundraising events. There are also materials from national-level conferences. Other conference materials and reports can be found in the Death Penalty and Printed Material series.

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Death Penalty, 1936, 1948, 1961-2016

Scope and Contents

The Death Penalty series, the largest in the collection, documents advocacy and research to eliminate the death penalty in NC, nationally, and globally; it includes records assembled by Alan McGregor in the 1970s, the Carolina Justice Policy Center (CJPC), and other organizations whose files were inherited by CJPC or who were in partnership with CJPC. There are many materials deriving from the Prison and Jail Project, both in its role as the predecessor organization to CJPC (1975-1982), and, after 1982, as a CJPC-based program.

In addition to organizational records, there are almost thirty boxes of materials by or about incarcerated people, chiefly white and African American men but also including several boxes of records about one woman, Velma Barfield, who was executed in 1984, the only woman to be executed in NC since the 1940s. Their case files typically include correspondence, writings, case information, clippings, and a few pieces of artwork by inmates.

Series content in general includes incoming and outgoing correspondence, casework, legislative information, many handwritten notes, and materials documenting a wide variety of support programs for individuals on death row and their families and allies at local, regional, and national levels. There are large numbers of print materials throughout, such as published reports, statistical charts, newsletters and other grassroots publications, pamphlets,

fliers, and news clippings. The series also includes several videos and a film about the death penalty.

Most of the materials originate from North Carolina, but there are many informational materials about capital punishment in other states, and a few materials about the death penalty in countries such as Japan and South Africa. Many of the materials also document religious organizations speaking out against the death penalty.

Materials documenting the work of the Prison and Jail Project are also found in the Prisons subseries, Projects and Partnerships series; these files contains records about several prison-related programs, including the "Friends and Families" program designed to support friends and families of the incarcerated.

Series documents the work of Alan McGregor and the activities of the many groups he worked for and with, particularly the Prison and Jail Project in the 1970s, the predecessor of the Carolina Justice Policy Center. Other groups whose work is documented in this subseries include the Southern Death Penalty Information Center, the Southern Coalition on Jails and Prisons, North Carolinians Against the Death Penalty, and others. There are also materials which have been interfiled from the work that was continued by PJP/CJPC once McGregor left.

Biographical / Historical

Alan McGregor (1951-) is an activist, writer, and non-profit administrator who started gathering information on capital punishment and individuals on death row in the South in the 1970s. At the same time, he helped establish the Prison and Jail Project, which eventually was renamed Carolina Justice Policy Center, continuing as a CJPC-based program with the same name, Prison and Jail Project. He was also the director of the Southern Death Penalty Information Center.

These records document Alan McGregor's work with the Prison and Jail Project (PJP) in its early years. Most of the work was focused on advocating against the death penalty and contains files on individual cases, correspondence with incarcerated people on death row, materials from other similar organizations, relevant legislation, newspaper clippings, PJP payroll, project development ideas, and a variety of research materials on the death penalty. There are also some materials on prison conditions, including prison budgets, living conditions, and prison construction.

Other items include an oversized map of Guilford County (housed separately for preservation purposes) and an audio track on 16 mm film with a one-minute public service announcement for the North Carolinians Against the Death Penalty (available in the Rubenstein reading room as an audio file).

Scope and Contents

These materials focus on programs which provided opportunities and resources for previously incarcerated individuals who qualified for alternative penalties, including rehabilitation, employment, and housing. The programs were an outgrowth of CJPC's efforts to secure alternative penalties through legislation for alternative sentencing, so some early files focus on these efforts instead of the actual programs, which weren't in full force until the 1990s and 2000s.

There are also two large statistical charts on felony punishments created by the Durham Community Penalties Program which have been separated for preservation purposes.

The focus of this subseries is on CJPC's efforts to improve north Carolina prison conditions and halt the building of private prisons in NC. Materials are arranged into topical subseries further subdivided by project, and may include correspondence, newsletters, photographs, articles, fundraising and legislative materials, and materials on alternative penalties for death row inmates. Also houses some inmate art. There are also some large tear sheets with goals and planning from a PJP meeting and an oversize 1970s chart showing NC Congressional districts.

The largest file group, the Prison and Jail Project (PJP), was the predecessor agency to the Carolina Justice Policy Center; in 1982 it was subsumed as a CJPC-based project which focused on prison reform.
